Teens Take the Lead at Families Forward

Each year, nearly 100 local middle and high school students participate in the Families Forward Teen Summer Volunteer Program. Participants in this immersive and fun opportunity spend one to two weeks volunteering in our classrooms to learn about early childhood education and share their talents with our students.

This summer, a group of our enthusiastic teen volunteers formed the first cohort of Teen Leads, a new addition to the volunteer program designed to provide leadership opportunities to youth that share a passion for service and community. Each individual has brought their unique strengths to the organization, enriching our classrooms and serving as role models and mentors to their peers.

In the spring, the Teen Leads met to set goals for their new group and discuss how they could support the success of the Teen Summer Volunteer Program. Their planning culminated in three teen-led volunteer orientations, weekly volunteer appreciation lunches organized by the Leads, a fundraiser that has currently raised \$4,000, and plans for an end-of-summer celebration where each Teen Lead will get "pied" in the face for each \$100 they raised!

Olivia is a rising senior at Westridge School and was eager to join the first group of Teen Leads. "I really love Families Forward, so I was excited about the opportunity to get more involved," she shared. "So far, I've enjoyed getting the volunteers to interact with each other more and create more bonds." Olivia has participated in our Teen Summer Volunteer Program for the past five years and often reflects on all she has learned since volunteering for the first time: "I've really grown passionate about equal access to education and I thank Families Forward for that exposure I wouldn't have had otherwise."

An Alumna Gives Back

In June 2009, a young Camila Morales walked across the stage and received her Pre-K "graduation" certificate from Families Forward Learning Center. Camila was part of the first group of students to enroll at the new Family Learning Center on Fair Oaks Avenue. A decade later, Camila is now 14 years old and preparing to enter ninth grade at Pasadena High School. Helping others is a clear value of Camila's, who is interested in pursuing a career in criminal justice and forensic science after she completes high school. She spent her first week of summer back where it all started: right here at Families Forward! Camila volunteered in the same room she played in as a child. "I thought it would be fun," she said. "I remember volunteers came and they helped me, they were there for me. I want to do the same for these kids."

On a Thursday afternoon in early June, Camila walks beside a line of eager preschoolers on their way to the library. One student has his hand in Camila's, keeping step with her and smiling widely. "It makes me happy to see the kids happy and goofy because I remember being like that," Camila says. "Getting to play with them makes me feel like a little kid again." At the library, she sits on the carpet and sings along with the music, demonstrating the hand motions to the student sitting beside her. She's beaming.

Camila has grown into a bright, curious, driven young woman, and she chalks that up to the years she spent at Families Forward. "They provided a great foundation for me," she says. "They made me a better person, taught me to be kind and make friends. Families Forward will always be with me." As our families with children in the Pre-K classroom prepare for their transition to elementary school, it is inspiring to get a glimpse of what life after Families Forward looks like for one of its former students. Families Forward Learning Center prepares families living in isolation and poverty to succeed in school and in life through two-generation learning programs. Our programs are built on two guiding principles: in order for significant, long-term change to occur within a family, you must reach both parent and child and educate them together; and, the most critical time to reach a family is when children are proven to be most vulnerable and impressionable, between birth and 5 years-old.

The Power of Two-Generation Learning

We fulfill our mission by providing FREE programs to disadvantaged families with children ages 0-5. Our two-generation learning model helps parents and children gain the knowledge, skills and confidence they will need to break out of poverty. National research and our own evaluation results confirm that increasing the education levels of both a parent and their child is an irrefutable way to promote long-term, positive change within a family and a community.
